



### St. George's Day

Saint George is the patron soint of many countries around the world, including Bulgaris, Croatia and England, St. George's Day is celebrated on 23th April every year. The symbol of Saint George is a red cross on a white background, which is also the flee of England and a part of the flee of Great Britain.

#### Who Was the Real Saint George?

Soint George was a soldier who was born in the year AD 270 in Cappadock, which is now in Eastern Turber He and his firmity were Christian and Ibed their lives following Christian values. When he was 17 years old, following the deaths of his father and webbe, he joined the Roman surry just as his further had began him.

By the age of thirty, Saint George was promoted to a higher rank and became an imperial guard of the Emperor, Diocletian. There are stories of him travelling



Sadly, he was beheated near Lydda in Palestine on 23" April in AD 303. His body was returned to Lydda where it was buried - Christians soon came to honour him as a marty.

23" April was named St. George's Day in 1415 when it became a national feast day.

#### What Is the Legend of Saint George?

Told for the first time in the 11" century (seven hundred years after Saint George's death), there is a famous legend about Saint George slaging a dragon to recue a princess. The legend stear has Saint George travelling to Libya, where a poison-spewing dragon was living as a lake, terrorising the local people. Young girls were being sacrificed to stop the dragon from attacking the city of Silene. When one day it fell upon the king's daughter, the king offere his people all of his niches to have his daughter power but the acceler refused and the princess was sent out to the look.

At this point, Saint George arrived and premiand to stop with the princase. When the dragon emerged from the water, Saint George charged at the dragon on his horse, wounding it with his fance before lenshing the dragon.

#### St. George's Day

Upon returning to Silene, Saint George affired to kill the dragon of the people would all become Christians. The city agreed as fifteen thousand men, including the king, converted to Christianity and Saint George killed the dragon.

Many people helieve this legend to be symbolic of Seint George's triumph over evil (the dragon) by refusing to give up his Christian faith.

Saint George is also the patron saint of scouts, farmers, shephends, soldiers and archers.

#### St. George's Day around the World

#### England

In the past, St. George's Day was seen as being an imperiant as Christmen but, following the union of Scatland and England in the early 15th century, the celebrations werend. #### Catalonia, Spain

In Catalonia, Spain, there is a similar legend about Saint George (Sent Jards) steging a dragen. A public heliday, with similarities to Valentine's Day, is held - roses and books are exchanged by people in low.

#### Bulgaria

Also known as Army Day in Rulgaria, 5t. Georgis' Day is celebrated on 6th May. Irreditionally, rural families ruest a whole lamb as Saint George is also the patron saint of shepharis and foresers. Many people also wells in the early marning, washing their faces in the firsth dew. which has been blessed by Saint George of the beginning of spring.

Saint George is one of the most important solets in Crossia as the patron exist of the military. This haliday (lessen as Durdevdari) is also a time to calebrate the neturn of spring, decorating hones with twigs and flowers, lighting fires and girls drawing as goddwises, singing for locals.





# Seven Days of Kindness

in celebration of Mental Health Awareness Week 2020 and the theme of kindness, we are encouraging primary schools to get mentally healthy by spreading a little kindness.

This calendar, designed to be used throughout Mental Health Awareness Week, encourages pupils to do two acts of kindness each day - one for someone else and one for themselves.

Depending on the age of the children, there are two calendars included. One has two suggested kindness activities for each day, which is best for giving to younger children, or using as an example for older children. The other calendar is blank for older children to complete with their own ideas.



#### Using this calendar - parents and carers

Show your children the completed seven days of kindness calendar, look at each of the days and pick a favourite activity that you could do for each other in lockdown.

Talk about why being kind might be difficult at the moment but why it is especially important and how it can bond you as a family.

Discuss self-care and why it is important to take some time to be kind to vourselves - like when mum takes a bubble bath or when dad goes for a bike ride.

Either create a family calendar of kindness or individual calendars - these can be a mix of self-care and kindness for others in the home. Remind the children of the calendar each day or share how you feel when they did a kind act for you.

#### More examples for the calendar

#### Being kind to others:

- Sitt with someone who looks lonely
- Be friendly to a child you aren't normally friends with
- Have a nice conversation with a loved one
- Ask a family member if they would like a drink
- Share a snack with a family member or friend
- Write your teacher a note or a poem about why you like them
- Clear the table after dinner without being asked
- Pick up three pieces of litter when you go to the park
- Smile and say helio to people you pass on the way to and from school
- Draw a picture for a loved one



#### Being kind to yourself:

- Do some gentle exercise
- Read your favourite book or watch your favourite film
- Co for a walk
- Play with your pet
- Write down 3 things you are grateful for
- Spend some time in nature
- Do some arts and crafts
- Have a dance party
- Wear your favourite outfit
